Our over riding theme for the first half term is the rainforest, we will be making links throughout different subjects to deepen understanding.

After the half term break, we will be looking at the Industrial Revolution.

In English this term, we are starting with the Grimms Fairy Tales: Tom Thumb. We will be looking at conjunctions and the use of speech.

We will be working hard to develop our handwriting, making sure that all our writing has a consistent style. Practicing colouring in and cutting at home really helps develop fine motor skills to aid handwriting.

PE is on Wednesdays and Fridays so your child can wear their kit to school on those days.

In RE we will start by looking at family before moving onto Baptism. You could share stories and photos of any family Baptism's at home. Closer to Christmas we will be preparing whilst looking at

In Science we will look at plants and how they grow. We will extend our learning by looking at a variety of interesting Rainforest plants. Our enquiry skill will see us practicing our evaluating skills.

We will then move onto Forces and Magnetism and will learn how to set up an enquiry and begin to record data.

In Humanities we will start with our Geography based topic of biomes and then move into British history and the Industrial Revolution.
