We can't believe that it is the last term of the year already. We will keep working on our independence to help equip ourselves for Year 4.

We are just finishing looking at Magnificent Maps before we look at our last history topic of Invaders and Settlers. This topic will start with an exciting drama workshop.

In English this term, we are starting with the poem 'Beachcomber' by George Mackay Brown. We will then look at another fiction text after the half term.

Please encourage any writing at home, this can be anything from writing a shopping list, thank you letter or short stories.

PE is on Wednesdays and Fridays so your child can wear their kit to school on those days.

Please make sure that all property that is brought into school is named.

There are a number of jumpers that are missing from last term. Please check any labels at home.

In RE we will start by looking at Pentecost before moving onto Reconciliation. We will also look at other faiths and their places of worship.

In science we will be looking at animals including humans thinking about the human skeleton and how our bodies work. Our enquiry skill will be questioning so encouraging your child to ask questions about the world around them will support their learning.

We really need to have a push on spelling and times tables this term.

Homework will be in the form of ixl and paper activities. All of these are picked to support and consolidate learning in the classroom and will be largely maths based.

The week before half term we will be going off curriculum to apply skills we have learnt to a week long topic about the Queen. We will be thinking about what the Queen does for us including her Green Canopy project.

It is vital that you keep in contact with the school through platforms such as Class Dojo as well as ParentMail. The majority of important notices are fed through these platforms. If you need help with these please ask.

We are still reading The Abominables by Eva Ibbotsham and will then move onto The Sheep Pig.

Keep reading everyday at home. The children have all made great progress in their reading. With reading, practice really does make perfect. You can share a variety of texts; from your child's school book, your favourite story as a child or explore a wide range of free books from the library.

In Maths we are looking at fractions before moving onto time, shape and then measure.

Keep practicing your times tables at home. Times Tables Rockstars will really help with this.

In Year Three we need to aim to have learnt our 3,4 and 8 times tables.
