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School Uniform

As we approach a new school year, many parents will already be purchasing items of school uniform. Jumpers, PE T-shirts, PE Hoodies, PE Kit Bags, Water Bottles and Book Bags can all be purchased direct from the school office or on-line via your SCOPAY account. All other items can be purchased at the supermarkets. At Our Lady's, part of our identity is our school uniform, and we pride ourselves in this. Therefore, I urge parents to ensure that children are sent to school wearing the correct, labelled uniform in September. The required school uniform, including the correct PE kit is:

<u>Girls</u>

Navy blue pinafore or pleated skirt School Navy/Sky Jumper White blouse—short or long sleeves with buttons Socks or Tights—navy Shoes—black school shoes (not trainers) Summer: Blue and white checked dress (from Asda)

<u>Boys</u>

Grey tailored trousers/ grey shorts School Navy Jumper Blue shirt or blue Polo shirt Navy Blue Tie (to be worn with shirt) Socks—grey Shoes—black school shoes (not trainers)

PE Kit for Girls and Boys

Trainers School PE T-Shirt Navy Shorts School PE Hoodie (Optional) Navy Tracksuit Bottoms can be worn in cold weather

Samuel Daw, in Cross Street, offers an embroidery service from only £2-3 per initials. It takes about twenty minutes and can be done while you wait. It may be just the answer for ensuring that your child can recognise their school jumper among over 200! It is perfectly acceptable to have your child's initials embroidered underneath the neck on the back of the jumper. Jewellery, with the exception of watches and small stud earrings, is not allowed. Make-up and nail varnish should not be worn to school.

Samuel Daws are now no longer selling our School Jumpers and PE T-Shirts. We are holding a stock of these in school and these can be purchased from the school office. All other items of uniform can be purchased from local supermarkets. Mrs Silverlock will be available in the school office until school breaks up on Wednesday 24th July and on two days before the children return to school on Tuesday 3rd and Wednesday 4th September. Children return for the Autumn Term on Thursday 5th September.

Reception class children start on Monday 9th September.

Please purchase new water bottles, book bags, Jumpers, PE T-Shirts, PE Hoodies or PE Kit Bags from the school office (cash or cheque only) or Via your SCOPAY Account if paying by card as required.

Music Tuition

We are able to offer various music lessons from outside tutors. If your child is interested in learning any musical instrument, and will be in Year 3 upwards then please inform the office. Lessons will commence in September and can be individual or group. The price will vary on timings and group sizes . If your child is eligible for Pupil premium, then the school will subsidise the lesson.

Music lessons available are: Flute, Violin, Guitar, and Keyboard. If there is sufficient interest in another instrument not mentioned then we will see if tuition can be arranged.

Please note this is for Year 3 upwards with the exception of guitar lessons which are available from Year 1

Just inform the office in writing what is required stating child's name, class and lesson/instrument required.
