School Uniform

Thank you for supporting the correct school uniform. Please could you ensure that all long hair is tied back for school, earrings are kept to small studs, no other jewellery is to be worn. Please ensure that all items of clothing, water bottles, lunch boxes and snack pots are clearly marked with your child's name.

PE kits should ideally be kept in school all week so that children have access to these to change for PE whenever needed.

Jumpers, PE T-Shirts, book bags and water bottles are available to purchase from the school office throughout the year.

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Welcome back to all our families. It's been exciting to see the Robins smartly dressed and raring to go.

Our new children have been delightful, getting to know the adults, other children and the routine.

Thank you for adapting to the new pegs routine it has helped the children to know where their things are and they have been very tidy because of it.

Please always let us know if someone different is picking up your child. Sometimes families can fall out, so even if it's a well known relative, we still need to know that someone with parental responsibility has given permission for that person to collect your child. Always keep us updated with any changes to circumstances.

We had a large number of items of clothing left behind last term, so please have a look through to see if anything belongs to you.

Tempest Photography will be in school of the morning of Monday 1st October. All children in Barn a Bs that morning will be photographed. You can attend from 7.30am with your children if you require a family photo to be taken or if your child does not normally attend pre-school on a Monday.

Lost Property

All items of school uniform, jumpers, water bottles etc that are found around the school will be reunited with their owners wherever possible by the end of the school day. Any items without names will be placed in a lost property box in the school hall.

Attendance

The school closely monitors attendance on a weekly basis and we work in partnership with the **Educational Welfare** Officer.



Medicines in School

If your child is required to take a prescribed medicine please can you alter the times around the school day. If this is not possible then please complete a medicine form at the school office.

The school can only administer prescribed medicines in line with government requirements.

Non-prescribed medicines such as headache tablets, medicated lozenges, nasal sprays etc must not be carried by the children or left in book bags.

Asthma Inhalers

If your child has a diagnosis of asthma and has a prescribed inhaler to use in school, please contact the school office and complete a 'parental agreement for school to administer medicine' form. Please see your class teacher if you wish to discuss any concerns about your child's medical conditions.

Absences from School

If your child is absent from school **for any reason** please telephone the school office (01271 345164) first thing in the morning. Mrs Welland will chase up unexplained absences each morning and where possible, make contact.

Please note that if your child has vomited or had diarrhoea, they must stay away from school until **48 hours** after the symptoms have stopped. If your child is unwell with symptoms of flu, please make sure they stay off school until they are fully recovered.



School Dinners

We have a wide variety of hot, freshly cooked, school dinners on offer on a 3 weekly cycle. As well as the healthy main choice there is always a vegetarian option and a jacket potato with cheese and/or beans available. Fresh salad and bread are also available daily. The meals are all

prepared on-site in our school kitchen. School dinners are free to all children from Robins to Puffin class and are a very competitive £2.30 per day for children in Owl class upwards.
