Teaching Sequence	<p>Fiction Lazy Jack Openings and Endings Speech punctuation. Children will use this text to inform their use of speech. They will look at a range of openings and endings and AMA children will begin to incorporate complex sentences to add depth.</p>	<p>Non-Fiction Rags to Riches Newspaper Article Features of a Newspaper. Children will learn what a newspaper looks like, how it is laid out and certain writing features that are used when report writing.</p>	<p>Fiction The Adventure at Sandy Cove How to write an action story. A fantastic Pie Corbett narrative that will support children's ability to write an effective action story. Children will learn the text orally through actions and story maps before creating their own inventions.</p>	<p>Non-Fiction A Beach Trip Features of a recount in the style of a letter. Letter writing is a very stylised way of writing and children will apply what they learn in order to complete their own letters. We will link this to our Topic based on Chocolate.</p>
Spelling and Phonics	<p>3 x 20 minutes spelling lessons per week. Using No Nonsense Spelling Scheme to learn key vocabulary and year 3 and 4 spelling list. Using working walls to aid spellings within writing. Spelling patterns and rules on working walls. Use of Nesso for individual children who require the tool. Children to be set spellings for homework and tested on those weekly.</p>			
Guided Reading	<p>Guided reading and AR to interlink - Chn will read with an adult once a week and answer relevant questions the following day. All children to have 20 mins of GR with KN per fortnight. Pre-reading of the text, time with KN and LJ and follow up questions to be included in fortnightly rotation.</p>			
GAPS	<p>1 x GAPS test per week. Grammar and punctuation to be taught using PWP games and activities throughout the week. This will also be embedded into the Talk for Writing teaching sequence. No Nonsense Grammar and Pie Corbett activities to support the learning in the classroom.</p>			



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
