Sal's Shoes

At the end of the Summer Term, the staff, children and families of St Margaret Clitherow decided that we wanted to support the 'Toe to Toe' initiative launched by the charity, Sal's Shoes. Sal's Shoes sends shoes to children across the world, protecting them from infection by parasite, a range of untreated injuries but above all enabling them to attend school. Parents were invited to make donations following our performances of Scheherazade which would

Parents were invited to make donations following our performances of Scheherazade which would go towards the cost of sending the shoes to their new feet. Three performances raised a generous £186.08. On the last day of term, the children came to school in 'mufti' but wearing their school shoes, many of which were still in quite good condition. Before leaving the school grounds, the children removed their shoes (and socks), placed them on the outside wall and made a £1 donation, adding £66 to our fund. Fortunately it was a dry day; in fact, it was so sunny that at the end of the day, when the children left the school in their bare feet, the ground was quite hot in places. It was a lovely gesture and a beautiful and moving sight as the length of the wall filled with pairs of shoes. Some parents even brought along brand new sandals and plimsolls! Altogether we raised £252.08 and sent 106 pairs of shoes to Sal's Shoes. The generosity of our school community didn't end there! The husband of our Administrator offered to package and dispatch the shoes at no cost to the school or to Sal's Shoes so we were able to send them every penny we had raised without contributing to Royal Mail!

At the end of a difficult year and at a very challenging time for our school community, we pulled together and were able to reach out to others less fortunate than ourselves which gave us all huge hope and the confidence to face the year ahead.

Pay Award for Teachers

Plymouth CAST Board has approved a 1% pay rise for all Teachers except those on MPS 1 who will receive 2%. This is line with the Secretary of State's response to the recommendations submitted by the Teachers Pay Review Body which were published on 10 July 17. The award will be backdated to 1 Sep 17 and will be paid in October pay statements.

General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR)

The Data Protection Act will be replaced by the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) in May 2018. Plymouth CAST preparations for the new regulations are underway and further information will be provided to all CAST schools before the end of September. Introduction of the GDPR has already sparked lots of new business opportunities in the Schools sector and it is inevitable that schools will be approached with offers of external support. Please politely declined these offers, if necessary referring them to the Trust's Chief Operating Officer.

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Shared Services



Health & Safety System

All schools within Plymouth CAST are now set up on the **O**perational, **S**afety, **H**ealth and **En**vironmental **S**ystem or 'OSHENS' for short.

OSHENS provides a Trust wide reporting system for all safety reporting and incident management, plus a comprehensive library of templates and policy guidance.

Plymouth CAST schools that used to be part of the Devon LA have used the system successfully without a hitch for many years. The main benefit of using it across all our schools will be the ability to identify areas for improvement to keep pupils, staff and visitors safe. Please note the OSHENS reporting threshold is for all accidents involving employees, contractors and visitors.

To prevent being overwhelmed by incidents involving pupils; OSHENS should only be used for recording where pupils are either sent home or to hospital. Anything less severe than that (for example bumps and grazes) should be recorded in a traditional 'accident book'.

Administrators received training in May and June 2017 and schools should now use OSHENS for accident reporting. Anyone needing top-up training or a reminder of their school log-in details should contact admin@plymouthcast.org.uk
