TOPIC

As we move into the Spring Term, we will begin our new topic 'Growing Green's and Grains'. We will start the term with our new key text 'The Enormous Turnip.' Through this text, we will learn all about growing foods and making healthy choices, leading us to writing and tasting our own vegetable soup recipes! After half term, we will look at the story of 'The Little Red Hen', before writing our own problem stories! The topic will be taught through a range of adult directed activities and group teaching, as well as through child initiated activities during 'free learning' time. Please be aware that sometimes topics may change as, in the Early Years Foundation Stage, we do work and plan closely following the children's interests. The children within the class are all learning at different rates and so activities are differentiated to ensure progress at their individual level.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

This half term, we will focus on 'going for goals', talking about our interests, what we can do well and what we would like to get better at. During the second half term we will focus on the topic 'it's good to be me', as well as how we can keep ourselves safe and manage risk effectively. Through the term, we will continue to develop skills and strategies in making relationships and managing our feelings and behaviour.

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

Our main focus this term will be on developing and extending the children's language and vocabulary. We will continue to develop our speaking and listening skills this term, gradually starting to build up how long we can attend to a guided task for. We will also work on following more complex instructions.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

The children will develop their core strength, balance and coordination skills through a unit of gymnastics during PE lessons. Within the classroom, we will continue to encourage the children to develop their fine motor skills through various games, funky finger activities and writing activities. The children will participate in Leap Into Life activities three times a week in order to develop other gross motor skills.

LITERACY

We will begin the term by revisiting the phase 2 and 3 graphemes that we learned last term. We will then move onto completing the rest of the phase 3 Letters and Sounds scheme through daily, whole class teaching sessions. Our focus this term will be on using and applying our phonics knowledge to both reading and writing, with a big emphasis on blending skills. We will continue to give children reading books from the reading scheme to take home and share, as well as activities to practice the sounds taught in class that week.

MATHEMATICS

This term, we will use all of counting and number skills taught last term to help us develop our understanding of addition and subtraction, beginning with combining numbers. We will focus on using mathematical language associated with addition and subtraction. Through daily number, we will continue to develop our knowledge of the number system and numeral recognition. We will also be applying our mathematical reasoning and problem solving skills through outdoor learning and a range of practical activities, including cooking.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

Much of our learning this half term will focus on 'The World' aspect of this curriculum area. Through our English texts, we will explore our local community, where our food comes from, and growing food and plants. We will set up a number of scientific investigations and enquiries to explore key concepts using our senses. After half term, we will focus more on people who help us in our community. We will also access simple computer programmes on the chrome books and interactive whiteboard to support our learning across all areas of the curriculum.

Our RE focus for this term is Revelations, moving onto Lent and Easter after half term.

EXPRESSIVE ART AND DESIGN

This term we will be encouraging the children through their free learning to explore various mediums including painting, creating models, engaging in role play and small world play, all of which will be linked to our topic and story book. During music lessons, we will be moving creatively to different types of music, learning new songs and learning how to play different instruments.
