Mathletics

Your child has recently come home with log in details to Mathletics, a new maths



initiative that we are using in school. This is a child friendly site, endorsed by the school, your child is safe to download this onto a tablet, chromebook or laptop and can then access maths games at home. Some tablets may need you to install Adobe Flash Player before the Mathletics App can be loaded. Alternatively you can access Mathletics via a normal website browser.

This week we are learning about how plants grow.

Studies show that children who have a wide and varied vocabulary do well throughout school. To help your child at home, try talking about the things you see. If you are on a walk, look out for different types of flowers and see if you can find out their names such as daffodils, dandelions, tulips etc. At our circle time we were looking at beetroot, turnips and swede – one child knew they were all types of vegetables.

Reading to your child is important for their development – we are happy to let the children borrow books from our book corner to read at home and return. Thank you to the parents that donate old books, toys or clothes – we can also make use of them.

As an exciting addition to our learning we have visitors joining us over the next few weeks. We have Mrs Recycle coming in to talk about recycling, Ranger Russ bringing in a variety of mini beasts and small animals, and Jiggywrigglers will be coming in after Easter for a series of sessions involving dance, music and stories.

Family Holiday Association Breaks at Mother Ivey's Bay

After successful trials last year the Family Holiday Association are happy to be partnering again this year with Mother Ivey's Bay holiday park to offer families quiet, relaxing breaks in Cornwall.

What are these breaks and who are they suitable for?

The breaks are at a smaller, quieter site than the all-singing all-dancing Butlin's or Haven parks. They do not have the same range of entertainment and activities on offer and provide families with a more laid-back, relaxed holiday experience. Breaks at Mother Ivey's Bay would suit families who:

- would enjoy or benefit from a quieter holiday
- are more confident about going on holiday and making their own entertainment
- have access to their own transport and would be able to use the break as an opportunity to explore the surrounding area.

Where are these breaks?

Mother Ivey's Bay is a caravan park on the stunning north Cornwall coast near Padstow.

When do these breaks take place?

There are a range of dates for these breaks across the year, both in and out of the school holidays. Once applications have been made we will contact you with the exact dates available and instructions on how to book.

What are the criteria?

These breaks are open to families who are on a low income, have at least one child under 18, who did not have a break last year and won't be having one this year.
